NEW STAFF AT DBMC!!





Sometimes blessings come from unexpected places or people. Such was the case with Patrick Morgan.

More than 14 years ago, Mary Morgan, asked us what we did here at the Center. After finding out, she gave us her husband's telephone number because she said that he was interested in teaching English as a Second Language classes to the immigrants who were enrolled in our program. Patrick lived in Belle Harbor, worked for AT&T in New Jersey and Dorothy Bennett Mercy Center in Bedford-Stuyvesant, Brooklyn. To any normal person, this would be a challenge; but to Patrick, it was an opportunity to teach and empower adults. He loved it and they, in turn, loved him.

Patrick had a passion to help others. His generous heart and his brilliant mind enabled him to see beyond the immediate challenges and see the positive outcome of any problem. After joining the DBMC Board of Directors, he devoted his talents to improve our programs, to reach beyond our present and to begin to expand our services.

Finances have always been an issue for small non-profit agencies, such as DBMC. Thus, we began a Fundraising Committee and elected Patrick as the chairperson. Our Annual Benefit at the Belle Harbor Yacht Club was his first fundraising event, and our 13th one will take place this year on Friday, October 11th. Patrick always took the welfare of the children and adults to heart. He requested to have additional lighting in front of the Center so the adults coming to night classes would feel safe. He also suggested we add security cameras outside and energy-efficient HVAC units. He was always thinking of everyone's safety and comfort at our "Small Center with a Big Heart".

Patrick invited some of his friends to join the Board and support this Mercy Mission. Who could say no to a man who gave so much to others?

It is said when you die, your legacy lives on in the lives of those you have loved and have touched. That is a very large and diverse crowd: his wonderful wife, Mary, his children, Jerry and Teresa, grandchildren, friends, and all the children and adults involved in the Dorothy Bennett Mercy Center. All his effort put into assisting the Center will always be deeply appreciated.

Patrick was indeed a blessing to all who had the privilege of knowing him. May he rest in peace.
